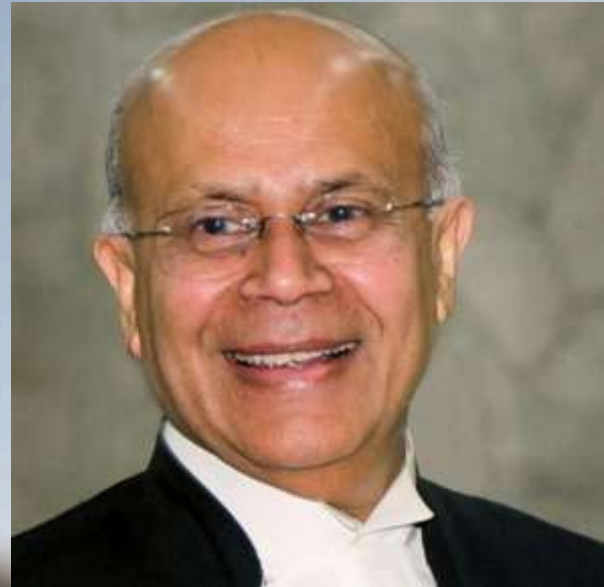

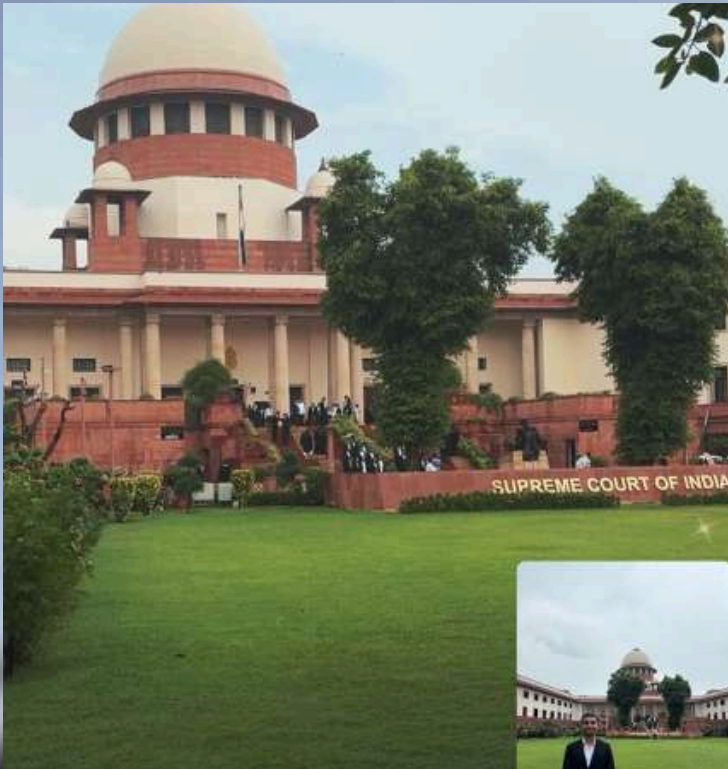
SELECTION AS A SPECIAL RAPPORTEUR AT THE UNITED NATIONS HUMAN RIGHTS COUNCIL

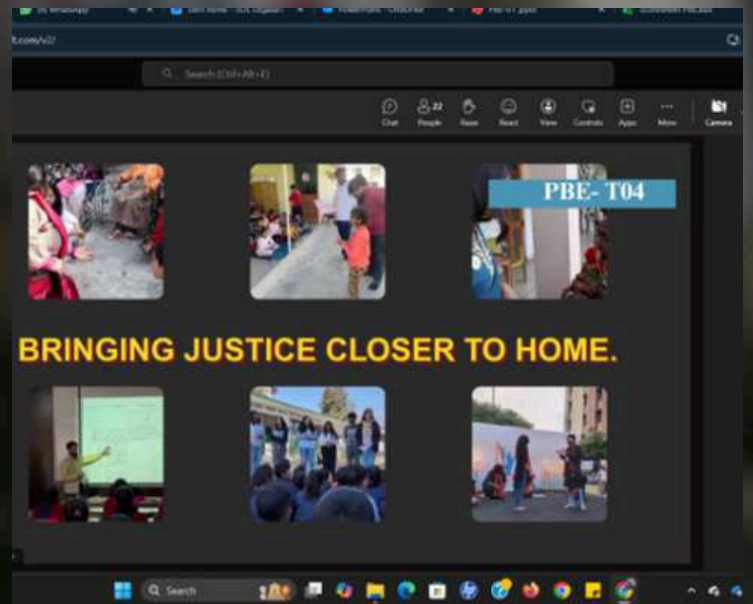
